Burning Money: Maintenance & Energy Efficiency of Old Houses

Would you like to explore ways that you can make your older house more energy efficient? Learn tips on tackling your older home's maintenance and energy issues while dispelling common efficiency myths.

This class is followed by a tour with Stan Hywet's Historic Architect Mark N. Gilles, AIA, speaking of the trials and tribulations of keeping the 65,000 square foot Manor House energy efficient.

House Makeover: Exterior Painting of Your Old House

This class will be followed by a tour of the lower level of the Manor House with Mark J. Heppner, Vice President of Museum Services Division. Mark has led much of the preservation work done at Stan Hywet Hall during the last 15 years. View the detailed work completed in "The Plunge," the Dressing Rooms, the Wine Room and other rarely seen rooms.

Historic Landscapes: The Marriage of House and Gardens

Have you ever wondered what your landscape might have looked like or what national trends existed when your home was built? This workshop discusses the features of early $20^{\rm th}$ century gardens, important national thematic elements and how you can make your own garden reflect the time period of your home.

This workshop is followed by a tour of Stan Hywet's gardens and grounds. What better way to conclude your day than to experience, firsthand, these restored nationally significant gardens? Given by one of Stan Hywet's expert garden guides, this tour is not one to miss if you are interested in historic restoration projects, landscape architecture or just a garden enthusiast.
